This poor kitty recently appeared on the front porch of Jeff, an AAMC foster volunteer. Jeff began bonding with the kitty through feeding and socializing.

This boy was emaciated, unsteady on his feet, and moved very slowly. He took up residence under Jeff's house.

The cat is a male of undetermined age. He has been neutered at some time in the past by a previous owner. ***He needs a name!*** If you would like to offer a suggestion please email Jeff at:

On March 8, 2021, Jeff noticed that the cat had developed a large abscess under the left eye. Fortunately, as a result of the bonding activity, Jeff was able to secure the cat and obtain medical care. He only weighs 6 pounds.

Rabies vaccine is now current, with all other vaccines to be updated in the immediate future.

The cat was treated for internal and external parasites, tested for Feline Leukemia and FIV, given antibiotics, the abscess was drained and cleaned, tested for ear mites, and a rabies vaccine was given. Fortunately the cat tested negative for diseases, ear mites, and external parasites.

He is now resting and rehabilitating comfortably in Jeff's house and appears to be a good candidate for future adoption. The overnight improvement after treatment was noticeable. He is an affectionate boy and loves to be petted. He immediately began using a cat box without hesitation. A high-protein diet is being provided, supplemented by a liquid vitamin solution, for a weight gain to an acceptable body weight of at least 8 pounds.
